School Land Trust Grant

Utah's School Land Trust Administration awarded \$100,245 to Springside last year, with a carryover of \$7,232 from the previous year. Funds were used to meet goals in Literacy, Math and Science. This included technology, teacher assistants, professional development, summer collaboration days for teachers, and equipment and materials. The school spent \$106,447 and will carry the balance forward to goals for 2019-20. Springside has been awarded **\$100,387 for 2019-20**. Funds will be used to fund teacher assistants, provide professional development and summer collaboration days for educators, and to purchase equipment and materials related to the grant. School Goals and Results 2018-19

Literacy Goal: Show a 5% increase in reading benchmark pass rates.

Math, Science, Literacy Goal: Show an increase in the percentage of students who demonstrate proficiency on state assessments.

Results: State results are not yet available for public release. Preliminary measures show that Springside maintained or increased proficiency levels.
